- In order to attend our Apprenticeship training school you must have a high school diploma or equivalent.
- You are required to complete 720 hours of course work and 8,000 hours of on the job training working for a licensed electrician as a registered Apprentice.
- Our classes are held 2 evenings a week allowing you to work during the day and giving you the opportunity to apply those hours to the required 8,000 hours.
- Working while attending school also allows you to apply your classroom training to your on the job skills. students can learn the ins and outs of the business by watching experts onsite and getting a chance to learn hands-on.
- You do not have to be currently employed by an electrical contractor or be a registered apprentice however, it is encouraged.
- The curriculum is reviewed by the American Council on Education awarding up to 40 college credits to apprentices completing four years of the IEC training curriculum.
- After enrolling, as part of your curriculum, you will be required to pass a math test, become certified in Adult CPR/AED and become OSHA 30 certified.
- IEC has a state-of-the-art training facility located in Rocky Hill Connecticut (I-91, Exit 24).
- Our instructors are certified by IEC National, are highly-committed and knowledgeable.
- We accept students from other schools; transfer students are welcome.
- The curriculum is reviewed and updated annually by the IEC National Apprenticeship & Training Committee. It is approved nationally by the Bureau of Apprenticeship and Training and locally by the CT & MA State Apprenticeship Councils.
